

GETTING STARTED


OVERVIEW

The eDART® Data Extractor enables the upload and download of eDART data and configuration files to and from a PC. The data acquired through the Data Extractor can be viewed and used in Analyzer. The eDART Data Extractor and Analyzer are part of the RJG Insight System software suite.

The eDART Data Extractor program consists of two main windows: the eDART List, and the eDART Data Extractor. The eDART List window displays all networked eDART systems and allows the user to select an eDART system to open in the eDART Data Extractor window; the eDART Data Extractor window allows users to get and put data, configurations, logs, security, and machine files between the PC and the selected eDART system.

LAUNCHING THE DATA EXTRACTOR

1. Open Data Extractor

Open the Data Extractor from either the RJG Insight System icon on the desktop, or from the Start menu.

2. Run Route Utility


If a User Account Control is enabled, the system will prompt for permission to allow the "route utility" program to run; select yes to allow the program to execute. The route utility program creates network routes to each eDART connected to the network, and is necessary for the utilization of the Data Extractor software.

3. Select an eDART from the eDART List

After Data Extractor program launch, a network broadcast message is initiated to detect all eDART systems. The eDART List window will appear, displaying a list of the eDART systems found on the network.

4. Launch the eDART Data Extractor

Once an eDART system is selected, select the Launch eDART Data Extractor button to open the eDART Data Extractor window.



REFRESH

Upon startup, the program may require up to 10–15 seconds to receive a response from networked eDART systems; if a networked eDART system fails to respond and is missing from the list, select the refresh button (1 at right) to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available eDART systems. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of eDART systems detected.

ADD


If a networked eDART system does not appear on the eDART list—even after a refresh—it is possible to manually add the system to the eDART List. Enter the eDART system's IP address in the provided field, then select the Add button (2 at right). If the eDART system is networked correctly and the IP address is valid, it will be added to the list.

VIEW eDART

To view an eDART system and current process using the Phindows utility (if installed), select the desired system from the eDART List, then select the View eDART button (3 at right).


LAUNCH eDART DATA EXTRACTOR

To view and eDART system with the Data Extractor, select the desired system from the eDART List, then select the Launch eDART Data Extractor button (4 at right). If the program cannot connect to the eDART system, an error message will be displayed; if the eDART system connection is available, the eDART Data Extractor window will appear.



EDART DATA EXTRACTOR

The eDART Data Extractor window has eight tabs from which a user can transfer eDART data, configurations, logs, security, and machines—to and from the eDART. Data is available by mold name using a time range selection.



GET DATA

To get data, a mold, date range, and save folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Get Data button(1 below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen; this action copies the data, leaving the original data intact on the eDART. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

LANGUAGE

Select the drop-down menu (2 below) to change the software language; US English (American English), Chinese (simplified), French, Italian, Spanish, and German are all available.

PICK SAVE FOLDER


Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to save any data exported from the eDART. RJG strongly recommends the use of the default folder to minimize the risk of misplacing data. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for download, and the data size.

PICK A MOLD

The Pick a Mold (4 below) portion of the window displays the available mold names which have data that can be exported. Select a mold from which to get data. If a mold is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available molds. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files detected available for download.

TIME RANGE SELECTION

The Time Range Selection (5 below) portion of the window provides two calendar views; one view for Begin Date Selection and the other for End Date Selection. A time range must be defined in order to get data.



GET CONFIGURATIONS


To get configurations, a mold and save folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Get Configuration button (1) below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

PICK A MOLD

The Pick a Mold (2 below) portion of the window displays the available mold names on the connected eDART which have configurations that can be exported. Select a mold from which to get configurations. If a mold is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available molds. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files detected available for download.

PICK SAVE FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to save any configurations exported from the eDART. RJG strongly recommends the use of the default folder to minimize the risk of misplacing files. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for download, and the data size.



PUT CONFIGURATIONS


To put configurations, a mold and save folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Put Configuration button (1) below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

PICK A MOLD

The Pick a Mold (2 below) portion of the window displays the available mold names on the PC from which configurations can be transferred. Select a mold from which to transfer configurations. If a mold is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available molds.

PICK CONFIGURATION FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to transfer any configurations to the eDART. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for upload, and the data size.



GET LOGS


To get logs, a log file and save folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Get Logs (1 below) button. The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

SELECT LOG FILES

The Select Log Files (2 below) portion of the window displays the available logs on the connected eDART that can be exported. Select a file from which to get logs. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files detected available for download.

PICK SAVE FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to save any logs exported from the eDART. RJG strongly recommends the use of the default folder to minimize the risk of misplacing files. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for download, and the data size.



GET SECURITY


To get security files, a security file and save folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Get Security button (1) below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

SELECT SECURITY FILES

The Pick Security Files (2 below) portion of the window displays the available security files on the connected eDART that can be exported. Select a security file to transfer. If a security file is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available files. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files detected available for download.

PICK SAVE FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to save any security files exported from the eDART. RJG strongly recommends the use of the default folder to minimize the risk of misplacing files. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for download, and the data size.



PUT SECURITY


To put security, a security file and security folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Put Security button (1) below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

SELECT SECURITY FILES

The Select Security Files (2 below) portion of the window displays the available security files on the PC that can be transferred. Select a security file to transfer. If a file is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available files.

PICK SECURITY FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to transfer any configurations to the eDART. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for upload, and the data size.



GET MACHINES


To get machine files, a machine and save folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Get Machines button (1) below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

PICK A MACHINE

The Pick a Machine (2 below) portion of the window displays the available machine names which have machine files on the connected eDART that can be exported. Select a machine from which to get files. If a machine is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available machines. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files detected available for download.

PICK SAVE FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to save any machine files exported from the eDART. RJG strongly recommends the use of the default folder to minimize the risk of misplacing files. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for download, and the data size.



PUT MACHINES


To put machines, a machine file and folder must be defined. To start data transfer, select the Put Machine button (1) below). The program will begin the data transfer; the status is displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel the transfer, select the Abort button.

SELECT A MACHINE

The Select a Machine (2 below) portion of the window displays the available machine files on the PC that can be transferred. Select a security file to transfer. If a file is missing from the list, select the refresh button to initiate another network broadcast message and locate available files.

PICK MACHINES FOLDER

Select the Browse button (3 below) to navigate to the location which will be used to transfer any machine files to the eDART. The status bar located at the bottom of the window will display the total number of files selected for upload, and the data size.



TROUBLESHOOTING

PROBLEM	SOLUTION
When transferring files, the eDART Data Extractor asks to confirm overwrite of files when the files being transferred are newer.	Confirm the time setting on the eDART is correct.
The eDART List does not display any of the networked eDART systems.	Ensure that the eDART network is accessible via test ping to an individual eDART IP address. Ensure the UDP traffic on port 55330 is not blocked on the network.
Manual connection to eDART system from Data Extractor fails	The manually-added eDART system must be reachable through the default route of the PC. If the PC network settings are manually-configured, ensure the net mask on the PC matches the net mask configured in the eDART system.
